

Dear Friends,

I can hardly believe this is my fourth Easter with you, but it is. The message of Easter never changes but depending on what's happening in the world and our own lives the part that hits home does. As I write this letter, Japan suffers deeply following the devastating earthquake and air strikes were made on Libya last night. The world always seems to be wracked with pain of some sort and each week I meet families trying to manage some tragic personal crisis or other. After so much unrest and revolution in the Arab nations over the last months and looking at the radical change in the Japanese landscape, I cannot but wonder what the world will look like this time next year both topologically and politically. The future is for many a time of anxiety and change.

Easter is about transformational change. On Good Friday Jesus was crucified and died, on Easter Day his dead body was transformed to one which was living and recognisable. Somehow God transformed disaster into triumph, hopelessness into joy, darkness into light. I do not believe that that was a one off event, but a miracle God still achieves in our lives and in the world day on day. Jesus' death and resurrection happened only once but demonstrates God's ability to turn round some of the devastating events we experience in our daily lives and on the world stage. Such are the material of our mini crucifixions and resurrections.

I believe in God as creator and sustainer of the world. He does not remove all the bad things at the wave of wand, but charges us with a great deal of the responsibility for what happens and the responses we make. The miracle is that he can bring good out of bad, success out of failure and light from dark. He can transform even the darkest hour into something valuable and positive when we work with him and for him. It can seem hard to believe when things are at their worst and it may take some time, but it is true. The world is a dynamic, ever changing place, but whatever strange turns it takes, God is always drawing us back to himself. And that keeps hope alive.

District and Parish Council Elections 2011

District and Parish Council Elections are to be held on Thursday, 5 May 2011.

SODC have advised that forms have been delivered to households in the parish so that a new electoral register can be compiled.

Please contact SODC on 01491 823000 if you have not received the form to ensure that you are eligible to vote at the elections in May 2011.

Interested in becoming a Councillor?

- Do you want to support your community and help to improve it?
- Are you prepared to work with other councillors to make decisions?
- Are you able to be objective and represent the needs of the whole community?

People usually become councillors because they care about their community and want to give something back. Baldons Parish Council provided funding for added value services such as additional village maintenance, grass cutting, etc. The Parish Council also provides support for various village activities.

You would be expected to attend most of the Council meetings, of which there are a minimum of six per annum, usually held on a Tuesday at 7.30pm in the Village Hall Community Hall. Other committees meet throughout the year as necessary. If you would like to become a Parish or District councillor, please contact South Oxfordshire District Council on 01491 823000.

Eligibility criteria

No experience of any sort is needed to stand for any council but the candidate must:

- be over 18
- be on the electoral register
- have lived or worked as a British / Irish / Commonwealth / European citizen or owned property in the area for at least the past 12 months

Evidence required

To stand as a candidate at any election a nomination paper must be submitted. The nomination paper gives details such as name and address etc.

To stand as a candidate in a parish council election two people will need to sign the nomination paper. These two people are known as proposer and seconder.

Application Process

The legal forms, or nomination forms, needed to stand as a Candidate are available from the Elections Office around two weeks before the election period starts. Nomination Forms can be obtained from the Returning Officer at SODC.

Last day for withdrawals	Thursday 7 th April 2011 (Noon)
Deadline for voter registration applications to be included on the register used at this election	Thursday 14 th April 2011
Polling day Polling hours: 7.00am to 10.00pm	Thursday 5 th May 2011

NUNEHAM COURTENAY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Annual Parish Meeting

A reminder that the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Thursday 7 April 2011 at Marsh Baldon Village Hall from 7.30 - 9.30 pm. This is an opportunity to come and meet the councillors and to discuss what the Parish Council is trying to achieve in a more informal manner than the usual Parish Council meetings. Bring your ideas and concerns – we'll listen and help if we can.

Parish Council Elections

The closing date for the nomination of Parish Councillors is 3 April 2011. At the time of writing no new nominations have been received. The existing Parish Councillors have agreed to stand if there are no new nominations. Elections will be held on 5 May 2011 if there are more nominations than the five councillors allowed.

Parish Council Meeting – 3 March 2011

The Parish Council met on 3 March 2011. A number of points were discussed at the meeting. The notes below show the main issues discussed and that have been attended to since the meeting:

Rubbish:

The Parish Council is helping one or two households to sort out rubbish issues. There have been promises that, by the time you read this newsletter, rubbish at the back of the garage will be cleared.

Horse-riding on pavements:

The Parish Council has followed up on this and visited a couple of stables. Notices will be put up on the bridleways indicating riding on pavements is prohibited by law and that fines can be levied. The PC is trying to avoid the situation escalating and police being called by residents – but with houses and gardens right up to the pavement it can be at least disarming and worst dangerous to ride on the pavements. The PC appreciates that the road is dangerous, but hopes that horse-riders understand the villagers' concerns.

Parish Plan

The aim of a Parish Plan is to find out parishioners' concerns and ideas for the future of the Parish. A meeting has been held with the Oxfordshire Rural Community Council to discuss the setting up of a Parish Plan and to obtain funding for the same. We hope to take the idea forward at the Annual Parish Meeting. However the Plan needs its own group to take it forward. Look out for separate flyers.

Working Groups

The idea of a working group is being pursued. Litter, cleaning and painting gates, clearing pavement drains etc. have been raised. The date needs to be agreed and we are checking out insurances, tools, etc... Please look out for further information and come and help.

Highways

A letter is to be sent to Highways:

- Noting the efforts being made in sorting out the hedges and trees on the verges. Hopefully the clearance will encourage new and substantial growth;
- Questioning why drains are being cleared twice a year rather than the four promised after the flooding and also timing on the same
- Pointing out the large number of dislodged kerbstones and deterioration of road edges

Planning

It is hoped to meet with planning and conservation officers to discuss broader planning issues in the parish.

Drainage

SODC's engineers, Monsons, are proposing a revised storm drainage route from that previously proposed - a new drain would be installed behind Church Row Cottages and into the ditch on the Arboretum boundary. The Parish Council has asked for a meeting to discuss the proposals.

Post-meeting update

Speeding

By the time you read this article the speed camera should be switched back on and a 40 mph speed limit approved for the stretch of the A4074 past the Arboretum. The Parish Council will be asking the County to come back and re-measure speeds through the village in due course to see whether any of the measures have reduced speeds through the village.

Gravel Extraction

As reported in the last newsletter the County Council's Cabinet had decided to take forward the minerals strategy excluding the sites at Radley and Nuneham Courtenay. The decision was 'called in' by West Oxfordshire Councillors and was reviewed by the County's Infrastructure Scrutiny Committee on 9 March 2011. The Scrutiny Committee agreed that the Cabinet had acted properly in making its decision. The next step is for the County's proposed minerals and waste strategy to be drafted and submitted for public consultation in June 2011. The Parish Council will keep monitoring.

Berinsfield Library

The Parish Council has not received any expressions of concern about the proposed closure of the Library. FROM THE COUNTY COUNCIL

Additional funding for highways maintenance

Phillip Hammond MP has announced an additional £100m for highways maintenance. It is calculated that OCC is likely to get around £1.1m as our share. A list of schemes that can now go ahead will be posted on the OCC website shortly.

Heritage Conference

On 22nd February I attended a conference at Clarence House jointly hosted by the LGA and the Prince's Regeneration Trust in my capacity as Heritage Champion. The topic was "Redundant Heritage Buildings - Problem or Opportunity?" HRH Prince of Wales, Baroness Andrews Chair of English Heritage and John Penrose MP Minister for Tourism and Heritage were among the speakers.

The issue is of great significance to some local authorities who own large, listed buildings that they may wish to sell off in an attempt to raise capital and save revenue costs. Our own Oxford Castle was used as a shining example of how council-owned historic buildings can be re-used successfully. I have asked our officers to supply me with a list of all the listed buildings that OCC owns, and to be kept informed as to whether any of them are likely to be sold off or altered as a result of the property rationalisation programme currently being undertaken.


