

News From Our Churches

The Season Of Remembrance

This year Remembrance Sunday will have a particular poignancy as it falls on Armistice Day, exactly 100 years since the end of the First World War. In common with many towns and villages across the country, we are marking this event with a special concert at 6.30 pm in St. Peter's, in addition to holding our traditional Remembrance service at St. Laurence's in the morning.

Our churches have been central to life in the villages for 800 years and they are places where generations of families have come together, have celebrated and also mourned. In them we can feel very connected to history and our own communities. They have been places of inspiration, of refuge, places of quiet peace and perhaps there have been times when they have been places of conflict. They are beautiful ancient buildings and they are there for us all.

The Armistice Day concert will take the form of a sequence of words and music in a variety of styles. It will be celebratory but also reflective, and performed by villagers and local friends. The school choir will be taking part and we hope everyone will join in with some community singing. The concert will start at 6.30 and will be followed by wine and canapés.

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

A number of villagers have asked about the financial position covering the day to day life of our two churches and the maintenance of the buildings. In one word, they are precarious.

Here is a summary of the annual financial statements for the past 2 years:

Our church life and buildings have to be financed entirely by villagers. **We get no help from the central church authorities.**

In 2017, 66% of the income is from gift aided giving, plus income tax recovered thereon, and we are extremely appreciative of the support received. The remainder of the income is derived from donations, fees and fund-raising activities. 82% of the expenditure covers clergy salaries, pensions, housing (otherwise known as the 'Parish Share') and expenses, together with insurance premiums for both churches. So just 18% is spent on items such as electricity, services, music and a contribution towards the newsletter costs.

The losses on general purposes have been financed from past giving and the reserves at 31 December 2017, stood at £6,830. The present forecast for 2018 is another loss of between £2,000 and £3,000.

As can be seen, there is nothing that can be done to reduce costs and the only way to eliminate these losses is to increase income and restore the reserves to a reasonable operational level.

Please help. Regular giving (monthly, quarterly or annually), supported by a completed Gift Aid form, is the most beneficial, or a one-off donation would also help significantly.

The costs of repairs and maintenance to our 2 church buildings are covered under separate Fabric Funds – one for each church. Details for each will follow shortly.

Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

Following the referendum on October 4th the result of the vote is as follows:

Votes Yes: 140
Votes No: 14

A big thank you to everyone who voted and supported the plan. It will now be formally adopted by SODC and used by the parish council and SODC when considering planning applications and development in the villages.

Planning applications

Highfield Nurseries. Baldon Lane. SODC has recently approved the outstanding application for a house on the redundant site of the paving previous paving slab business.

Oxford to Cambridge Expressway

There isn't a lot of new information on planning for the Expressway this month although there is regular comment from different bodies in the local media.

The Expressway action group (EAG) are seeking more information from the Highways about the route planning to give a better idea of those communities likely to be most affected by the options and those less so.

It is also likely that villages will have to undertake substantial fundraising and campaigning in preparation for and the during the consultation period in 2019.

NUNEHAM COURTENAY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next meeting of the parish council is on Tuesday 6th November at 7pm in the Village Hall. Meetings are always open to the public but, if you want to address the Council Meeting, please let Madhvi know in advance.

I'm afraid the Parish Council does not yet have a date for the parish meeting to discuss South Oxfordshire District Council's new guide to the Nuneham Courtenay Legal Agreement.

South Oxfordshire District Council's contractors have arranged to come to the parish for three days from 16 - 20 November to carry out a deep cleanse.

The team will be litter picking, sweeping and removing weeds/moss on pavements. It will not spray weeds, cut grass or vegetation or remove weeds and moss that is on roads and it only clears land to which the public is permitted access and that is under the direct control of South Oxfordshire District Council.

If there is anywhere in particular in the parish that you would like to be cleaned, contact the Parish Clerk (nunehamcourtenay.clerk@gmail.com or 07419 991623) or speak to a member of the Parish Council. The Clerk will send in the final list.

And on a related subject the Parish Council has bought four smart new litter bins (dual purpose - for litter and dog waste) which will shortly be installed on the main road.

The Parish Council has taken legal advice about a lease offered by the Playing Field Association and decided it did not, unfortunately, provide a basis for negotiation so is going to put forward a draft of its own.




