
# The Baldons and Nuneham Courtenay Newsletter

neither shall they learn war any more.


Yes, November can be a month for remembering past experiences and the special people who have played an important part in our lives, however, today is always an opportunity to make new memories for the future.

# **BALDONS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

The council met on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2023. Current updates:

## Recreation /play area questionnaire

The Parish Council has been asked by some residents to consider the addition of recreational facilities for Children and/or outdoor exercise equipment for both Children and Adults on the Village Green. The Council is keen to hear the views of villagers before the possible project is discussed at a council meeting. There is an online questionnaire available via a link sent via Baldons Info email. If you have not received the email, then you can access the questionnaire by typing the following into your browser search bar.

This is the first stage in a long-term project and further consultations will happen to ensure everyone can have their say. The form is anonymous and email addresses will not be collected. The questionnaire will close on 12<sup>th</sup> November and the results will be shared shortly after that.

# **Planning matters**

At the time of writing the following applications are under consideration:

# P23/S3127/HH

Durham Leys Farmhouse The Green Marsh Baldon OX44 9LP Erection of new car port and store.

# P23/S3254/FUL

Hunters Gap 52 Pebble Hill Toot Baldon OX44 9LH Erection of two dwellings with access and associated works.

Due to the time limited planning application consultation periods, often the planning applications that are highlighted in the newsletter have been closed to comment by the time it is published. In the future, the Parish Council will post notifications of new planning applications for the Baldons via Baldons info email in addition to the newsletter. This will ensure that circulation occurs within the consultation period for those applications.

### Recruitment of Clerk to the Parish Council

The Clerk's role and contributions are critical to the smooth and efficient operation of Parish Council. Tom James has performed this role for nearly 5 years. However, Tom's wish is now that we plan for his successor.

Working for the Parish Council, the role involves the administration of all Council affairs, which includes maintaining the financial accounts, records of all meetings and ensuring the Council remains compliant with current legislation. However, if required, the financial accounting role and Clerk duties can be performed by 2 separate individuals. Both posts are a part time position.

## **NUNEHAM COURTENAY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

### **Former Cockadoo**

The Council has invited a local developer to address its next meeting on Tuesday 7th November after they wrote to the Council saying they are interested in bringing the building that used to be The Cockadoo back to life with options to create homes or hospitality facilities.

## **Pruning the London Plane trees**

The County Council tells us the pruning of the historic London Plane trees on the main road through the village is now likely to happen in November – it was originally planned for July.

### **Eco-houses**

South Oxfordshire District Council has rejected an application to build two "ecohouses" on part of the land at the northern entrance to the village.

### The Council's noticeboard

The Council's noticeboard was removed from outside the Village Hall a few months ago when work was being done to smarten up the former deli – historically, the former reading room. So, for the time being, the Council has been given permission to use the small noticeboard on the outside of that building.

## **Next meeting**

The next meeting of the parish council is due to take place on Tuesday 7th November at 7pm in the Village Hall.










# Worried about falling?

## FROM JOHN HOWELL MP

When someone needs help with something it can be difficult to know just who is responsible for what, and therefore who can help when things do not go as they should. I thought that it might be helpful if I set out who does what.

It is often thought that an MP sits at the top of a hierarchy of Government and has power to direct local councils. This is not the case. Local councils are autonomous, and MPs do not have any jurisdiction over local council decisions. Hence local councils have their own elected representatives in the form of councillors. People elected to these councils have direct access to officers at the respective councils and so are better placed to take up relevant issues. I have found that referring to local councillors is the quickest way to get action. Some local council teams can be quick to respond to me but of late some have started treating concerns raised via my office as formal complaints and as such can take several weeks to be processed.

So, to help steer through the hierarchy let me set out who does what.

Essentially as an MP I can help with issues and concerns that relate to central government departments. For example this may include issues relating to the HM Revenue and Customs, Visas and immigration, the NHS, or pensions and benefit issues.

Oxfordshire County Council is responsible for local services, including education, social services, transport, roads (except trunk roads and motorways), public rights of way, libraries, the fire service, culture, trading standards, bus subsidies, minerals, waste and recycling (disposal) and the environment.

The constituency is served by two district councils, Cherwell District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council. They are responsible for local services, including planning, housing and associated benefits, rubbish collection, environmental services, leisure services, some car parks and council tax collection.

Parish Councils and Parish Meetings deal with very local concerns and can influence the other councils on behalf of residents.

It may also be helpful to comment on requests to attend specific events. When Parliament is sitting MPs are expected to be in Westminster from Monday to Thursday, unless on other parliamentary business elsewhere. This means that it is not always possible to attend a particular debate or drop-in session that a constituent may ask me to attend. When I cannot attend something it does not reflect lack of interest, simply that I cannot be in two places at once.
