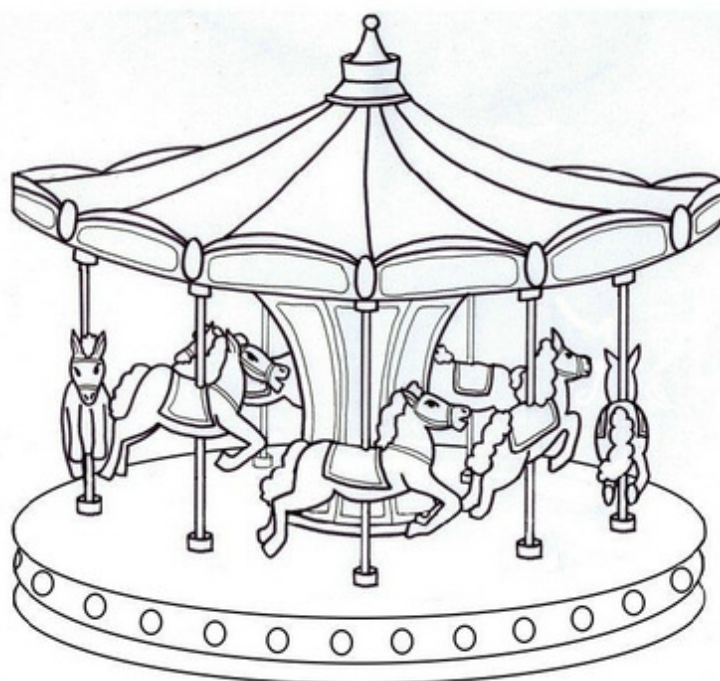

Dear friends

So many of us will be going away on holiday sometime this summer. The risk of rain is always a feature of our English summers. I was away last week in Somerset and yes, it rained a lot. I was not able to enjoy the outdoors as much as I'd hoped but that's England for you. But even though the weather was disappointing and I was there to study anyway, I came back energised and in much improved mood than when I had left. I did enjoy my break but the benefit seems not so much what I did whilst I was away, but the way I saw things differently when I came back. All the little things that had been niggling me seemed not so important, everything seemed restored to more manageable perspectives. So often I plan my holiday with such high expectations. I imagine I am going to discover something wonderful, and I have indeed seen many amazing places around the world. But I have also discovered the greatest gift of a holiday can be the changed perspective on the ordinary things at home on my return. I just seem to enjoy them so much more when I have been away for a while. I come home much more settled and stable. Whilst away, I discovered these words by Anthony Bloom of the Russian Orthodox Church, they seem to reflect something of what I discovered.

“What is it then to be stable? It seems to me that it may be described in the following terms: You will find stability at the moment you discover that God is everywhere, that you do not need to seek Him elsewhere, that He is here, and if you do not find Him here it is useless to go and search for Him elsewhere because it is not Him that is absent from us, it is we who are absent from Him. ... It is important to recognize that it is useless to seek God somewhere else. If you cannot find Him here you will not find Him anywhere else. This is important because it is only at the moment that you recognize this that you can truly find the fullness of the Kingdom of God in all its richness within you; that God is present in every situation and every place, that you will be able to say: ‘So then I will stay where I am.’”

Don't cancel the holiday – enjoy it but enjoy home even more when you get back. Safe journeys!

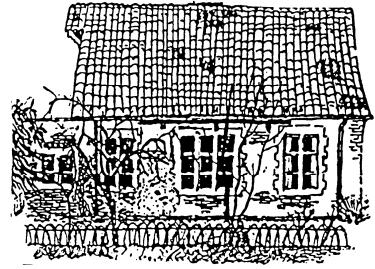

BALDONS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Flooding Problems Baldon Lane

Arising from the problems of a broken sewage pipe in Baldon Lane in March and at the request of Mr Keith Messenger, acting on behalf of his mother who lives in Baldon Lane, members of the Baldons Parish Council met with Mr Messenger and representatives of Thames Water and Oxfordshire Highways to discuss the periodic flooding problem and available solutions. It was agreed that the main problem has been inadequate sewage pumping capacity in Thames Water's pumping station in Baldon Lane, exacerbated by poor surface water drainage in the area during periods of exceptionally heavy rainfall, causing the pumping station to fail. Thames Water are planning to uprate and improve the pumping station which should make a significant difference: Baldons Parish Council will energetically encourage Thames Water to implement this proposal as soon as possible. In addition the risk of flooding will be further alleviated by clearing the nearby ditches and water courses so that any surplus surface water can escape from the low point in the road.

As mentioned in a recent newsletter land owners do have a riparian responsibility to keep ditches and water courses adjacent to property clear and free flowing and it is hoped that villagers / landowners will help and cooperate with this.

Oxfordshire County Council Library service consultation

Earlier in the year the OCC announced a plan to review and possibly close a number of libraries as part of their need to save money. Following that consultation and feedback the OCC has developed new proposals for the future of the library service. The proposals include the retention of all libraries. A core group of libraries will remain fully funded and staffed, which includes the Berinsfield library previously suggested for closure. Other libraries with lower levels of usage are also intended to be retained but with some participation from volunteers towards the day to day running. Full details of the proposals are on the County Council web site for 4 months consultation ending on 30th September to which anyone can respond. <http://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/libraryserviceconsultation>

Register for FREE with the MPS, who will arrange for your details to be taken off the mailing lists of companies who send unsolicited mail. They can also remove the details of a previous occupant of your address. Up to 95% of unwanted addressed mail can be stopped with MPS.

2 **Cut down on unaddressed mail** with Royal Mail
Royal Mail delivers about 25% of the total volume of unaddressed mail in the UK.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on **Tuesday 5 July 2011** at **7.30 pm**. We are very pleased to be able to return to **Nuneham Courtenay Village Hall**.

The meeting is open to parishioners and we would be delighted to see you there. Any items for discussion should be notified to the Clerk a minimum of seven days before the meeting. Alternatively matters can be raised at the meeting, but the answering of any question may have to be dealt with after the meeting.

Agendas and minutes of meetings are available on the NCPC website and are normally posted on the notice-board outside the Village Hall. Agendas and minutes will also be e-mailed upon request.

General Update

- **Planning applications**

Old Post Office: The applications for listed building and planning consent for change of use from shop and store to craft workshop and store were approved by South Oxfordshire District Council on 31 May 2011.

29 Nuneham Courtenay: An application has been made for planning and listed building consent for a new extension at the rear of the property. The plans were presented at the last committee meeting. The applications are due to be determined by 4 July 2011.

- **Highways.** The County's drainage engineer has been contacted following the recent less than comprehensive clearing of road and pavement drains. A meeting will be arranged shortly. No response has yet been received from the Highways Area Steward regarding other highways matters - as well as kerbs, the increasingly damaged road surface and speeding issues, the Parish Council has also been asked to take forward a request for increasing the bicycle racks at the Baldon Lane bus-stop and to seek the replacement of road-markings on the A4074 where these are wearing away.
- **Drainage.** The Parish Council has not been formally notified but, at the time of producing this article it is understood that works are shortly to commence on the by-pass drain running at the rear of the allotments on the west side of the village.
- **Grants Policy.** The Parish Council now has a grants policy, and some very limited funds, for making available small grants to organisations and groups that would bring benefit to the Parish. A copy of the policy is available on the NCPC website. Applications should be made in writing to the Clerk.

Strength and Relaxation Exercise Classes

Why would you go to an exercise class in the village hall? It might be full of superfit people who can do all the exercises with ease ... and do you really want to exercise in front of people who know you? Is this really where you want to spend your evening? Wouldn't it be better to follow up that resolution you have had for years to join a gym? Or follow up that other resolution to take exercise by walking around our beautiful villages?

In an ideal world we'd all take our exercise by walking or cycling everywhere, or going to the gym regularly. But the reality is that for whatever reason, be it the weather, lack of time or impracticality, we don't walk / cycle everywhere, even within our villages. And finding the time (and money) to go to a gym can be tricky.

So some of us in the village started going to the Strength and Relaxation exercise class run by Caroline Wilkes in the Baldons Village Hall on a Wednesday evening. This small group is of mixed ability, and the exercises are tailored to this, with more or less "stretching" exercises. Caroline caters for all ages, from newly post-natal mums to those of more mature years.

The class starts at 7.45, to allow people to get home from work / eat / put children to bed or whatever, and costs £5.80 for a one hour session. Clothing is "comfortable" rather than skintight gym kit, and the atmosphere is informal (although at the end you realize that you have been gently pushed into doing some real exercise!)

The emphasis is on improving strength, flexibility and overall wellbeing, rather than lots of leaping about! Many of the exercises are based on yoga or pilates, but Caroline has developed her own style of class, based on more than 16 years of experience teaching exercise. Caroline's understanding of the human body and behaviour and the benefits of exercise also comes from psychology degree studies and holistic massage which focuses on the body as a whole..... physical, emotional and spiritual.

After a few weeks, we really started to feel the benefits, discovering abilities and flexibility we thought we never had, or was lost and gone for ever! And after a few months our overall fitness levels have improved markedly.

So come and join us and fulfil that resolution to take up regular exercise – right in your own village!
